What does a typical week look like?

Class A (14-16 years old):

15 hours of English + a range of academic subjects from the following:

International Business, International Current Affairs, Environmental Science, Psychology, Sociology, Art & Photography,

Class B (16+ years old):

15 hours of English + a range of academic subjects from the following:

Economics, International Business, Geography, History, Environmental Science, Modern Languages, English Literature, British Culture, Art & Photography.

The summer course also contains a full activity and excursion programme to locations of cultural and historical importance.
